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<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Talking about permission - Talking about obligation and prohibition - Talking about necessity and lack of necessity - Giving suggestions and advice - Buying things - Pointing and describing what one wants - Asking for quantities - Asking for / saying the price - Describing and comparing (people, animals, places, possessions, etc.) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>Can, may</i> (permission): affirmative, interrogative and negative form - <i>must, mustn't</i> (obligation and prohibition) vs <i>have to / don't have to</i> (necessity); - <i>need / needn't</i> - <i>should / shouldn't</i>; - <i>Can</i> for requests - Demonstrative adjectives and pronouns: <i>this (one), that (one), these (ones), those (ones)</i> - <i>little vs a little; few vs a few; none</i> - <i>enough + noun</i> - Comparative: adjective (-er) <i>than...; more / less + adjective than...</i> - Spelling rules - Possessive pronouns: <i>mine, yours, his, hers</i> - Question word: <i>Whose ...?</i> - Modifiers: <i>quite, very, really + adjective</i> - Superlative: <i>the +adjective (-est) of /in...; the most +adjective of / in; the least + adjective of / in...</i> - Adverbs of manner: <i>-ly</i> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Words for rules and regulations • Actions in the classroom, at school, in the street N.B. <i>No parking; No smoking</i> • Shops and shopping items • Food and drinks • Money and prices • Expressions for shopping routines: <i>Who's next?
